Is there any change to the root word?

If the root word doesn't end in an 'e', no change is needed when -ation is added.

inform + ation =
information

If the root word ends in an 'e' (but not 'ate'), drop the 'e' when -ation is added.

imagine + ation =
imagination

sense + ation =
sensation

prepare + ation =
preparation

organise + ation =
organisation

adore + ation =
adoration

If the root word ends in 'ate', drop the 'ate' when -ation is added.

concentrate + ation =
concentration

exaggerate + ation =
exaggeration

locate + ation =
location

educate + ation =
education
