The Roman Army

- Only Roman citizens could become soldiers
- Recruits had to be 25 and serve for at least 20 years
- Legionaries (Soldiers) were not allowed to marry whilst they were in the army
- Non-Romans who wanted to join the army were known as Auxiliaries and had to have special skills such as an archer.
- If a soldier deserted, left their post or fell asleep on look-out they were beaten to death by their fellow soldiers

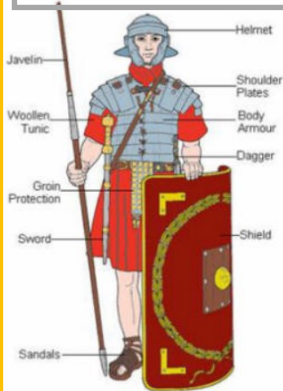

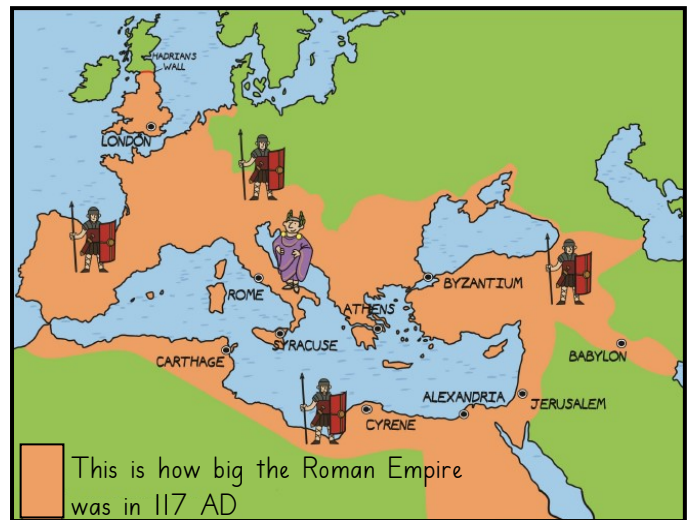
