

UNIT 23 Conjunctions

Conjunctions are joining words.

We use them to **join** sentences.

Give me the rubbish. I will take it outside.

Give me the rubbish **and** I will take it outside.

The sky was grey. It didn't rain.

The sky was grey **but** it didn't rain.

Another useful **conjunction** is **or**.

I will have the chocolate biscuit.

I will have the plain biscuit.

I will have the chocolate biscuit **or** the plain biscuit.
