



UNIT 21 Adverbs

An **adverb** tells us more about **how** something is done.

He walked **quickly**. She read **slowly**.

Adverbs can also tell us **when** or **where** something is done.

When? I saw my friend **yesterday**.

When did you **see** your friend? **Yesterday**

I will tidy my room **later**.

When will you **tidy** your room? **Later**

Where? I have put the books **here**.

Where have you **put** the books? **Here**

I looked **everywhere** for the cat!

Where have you **looked** for the cat? **Everywhere**
